Take a few minutes with Pastor Lexy

"How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." I John 3:17-18

Greetings Beloveds!

The phone has been ringing constantly this morning. Unless something changes in the next few days (from when I am writing this on October 27th), SNAP benefits will not be sent out to those who need it on November 1st. Government workers continue without pay, and are starting to worry about their own grocery bill. For those reaching out for help from resources they have depended on in the past, they are being told- go to the churches, they can help.

And we do our best to do that, in our own limited way, every day. Thank you to those who have already been so generous with our food shelf, you offered a sigh of relief when callers found out we had *something* that could at least buy them a day or two. This morning, two members have also stopped in the office, asking if we're planning to send out a message asking people (if they are able) to give to our shelf, knowing the wave that is approaching. It is easy to get stuck in fear, especially in times like these. A place between frustrations at systems that should be helping and wishing we could do more with our own limited means.

God reminds us, though, to not be afraid. There are times when our faith calls us to reflect, to pray, and share words of comfort, and there are times where our faith calls us to act. This, beloveds, is the time for the second. If you can, donate to our food shelf (shelf stable, pop top items) or one of the many food pantries in town (money goes the furthest there!). If you can't donate financially, donate your time and volunteer. If you can't donate your time, repost their requests on social media, or talk to your friends and neighbors about what you can do to help. Let us love in deed and truth, the truth that as Christians living in this "house of bread", we believe that food is a right, not a privilege.

Parish Planning Council Minutes October 16, 2025

Present: Jim Sandsmark, Pastor Lexy, Brigham Drevlow, Kelly Nielsen, Shannon Brager, Dave Buen, Erik Larson, Mathew

Potter, Cathy Hanson, Aimee Livdahl, Sue Gomke, Judy Coughlin, Tim Deyle.

Executive Director Jim Sandsmark called the meeting to order. Pastor Lexy led the group in opening prayer.

A motion to accept and approve the September 11th meeting minutes with no revisions was made by Dave Buen and seconded by Mathew Potter. The motion carried.

Board Reports

Parish Education – Sue Gomke. Two 3rd grade students will receive their Bibles in worship on Wed night. The board discussed mailing Bibles to students who cannot attend the service and giving Bibles to older kids who have not gotten one before. Confirmation will be Oct 26th and the board has arranged the photographer, flowers, gifts, and cupcakes for fellowship time. The Christmas program this year will be A Very Whirl Christmas. The Parish Education budget has been submitted.

Trust Foundation – Cathy Hanson. Three requests were approved in Sept for \$500 each. The board will meet in Dec for any new submissions since there is still money available. Recent requests were all for \$1,000 so if there are no new submissions, they may be revisited.

Worship –Tim Deyle. The Worship Band Director position was approved at the last meeting. Approximately \$5,500 will be added to the budget to accommodate. The board also discussed pay raises to keep competitive with other churches for future accompanist needs. All Saints Day services will look the same as last year. There will be an afternoon remembrance service followed by Beer and Hymns at the 4 and 4. Other churches have been invited to join. An Advent curriculum has been selected, and an anonymous donor has already paid for it. Deck the Halls will be the first Wed of Dec with the confirmands. The board wants to look around beforehand to see if there are any improvements that can be made. Poinsettias are the traditional flower to purchase for Christmas, but the cost keeps going up and the plants have not stayed in good condition. The board will look into options of different flowers or possibly artificial versions.

Property – Dave Buen. The potential buyer for the lot across the street has lost interest. We have gotten two plumbing estimates for the bathrooms, the more realistic of the two is \$7,800. We also need an estimate for taking the tile off of the walls and for flooring. If we are putting grab bars in, then a permit is required since the walls will be opened. Stalls cannot be made wider due to concrete anchors so we will look at other adjustments that can be made. The 2026 budget has been mostly approved.

Ministry – Erik Larson. Two staff evaluations were performed this month, with one to go. The budget was updated with payroll software additions and Portico insurance changes. Two bills were approved – a pulpit supply payment and mileage.

Evangelism/Fellowship – Mathew Potter. Karley Dittberner came to the meeting with ideas to engage with the community, such as a store with church bucks, a garage sale, and blessing bags/hygiene kits. The website is mostly completed, with only cosmetic fixes to be made, which can be done on our end. It should be ready to launch before the year is done. The freezer meal event will be held Nov 15th along with a food drive held Nov 12th and 16th, which Mathew will provide a Temple Talk for. The Giving Tree is being planned out. We will move from 5 gifts per person to 4 so we can accommodate more people. We will also add tags for Matthew's Voice. The tree should be set up before Thanksgiving Eve Eve. The board's budget is approved.

Stewardship – Kelly Nielsen. Consecration Sunday went well. There was good feedback about Beth's skit. The budget is mostly approved, and salaries are being given a 3% raise. Dave Buen came to the last meeting to talk about future projects and what fundraising needs will be. There are no college students eligible for scholarships this year. Noisy Offering is now to be counted by the Stewardship Board. The next meeting date is to be decided.

Youth – Shannon Brager. Ohhh Snap has had around 14 kids in attendance. Paternity leave needs for Brigham have been planned for. Castaway had 7 BLC youth and 2 chaperones in attendance. Wreath sales started Oct 15th and will go through Nov 12th. Cost is \$30 each. The Halloween party will be Oct 29th after worship and will be held indoors. Parents' Night Out is scheduled for Nov 23rd. The budget is nearly done.

Treasurer's Report – The sweep loan is at \$61,897.

Pastor's Report –Kaleidoscope went very well. Pr. Lexy's workshop on Narrative Budgets was one of the popular presentations of the conference, which has led to future presentation opportunities. Pr. Lexy will also be meeting with Tim Brown who has great info about legacy giving.

(Parish Planning Council Minutes Continued)

Old Business

There was an incident with a member after a Wednesday night worship service which led to concerns about students feeling unsafe at church. Due to this, the board voted to issue a no trespass order to the member, which will be handled by Pr. Lexy Steinle. Parents have been informed about the situation via email.

New Business

There have been two new requests for using space at Bethlehem. One is a church almost entirely made up of immigrants and international students who are looking for a worship space. They currently meet 11:00 a.m. on Sundays and worship approximately 50 people per week. They would also need Sunday School space at 9:30 a.m. and room for weekly Bible study. They are affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention, which would need more discussion to determine compatibility. The other request is a recovery group that is doing a 16 week course on hoarding on Tuesday nights. They will be asked about rental fees.

A motion to dismiss the meeting was made by Dave Buen and seconded by Sue Gomke. The motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting of Parish Planning Council will be November 13th at 7:30 p.m.
